She has received many awards throughout her career and was recently named an outstanding graduate of her master's program in reading education.

She is the author of *The Tao of Teaching*, *The Tao of Parenting*, and *Effective Grouping for Literacy Instruction* as well as numerous articles, including several used for teaching training in multicultural education. Her books are now in seven languages.

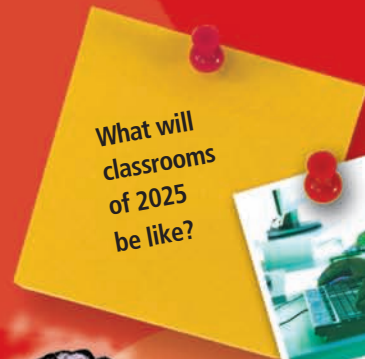
