Fullerton Arboretum OC Agricultural and Nikkei Heritage Museum to host *Two Roads, One Journey* Exhibit from September 11 through December 11, 2016

The Fullerton Arboretum OC Agricultural and Nikkei Heritage Museum will host *Two Roads, One Journey, Education in China and the United States*. This exhibit is created and presented by The Museum of Teaching and Learning. It reveals the power and cultural influences of education in the United States and China, showcasing the points of pride and challenge for both countries.

The exhibit will explore intriguing similarities and differences and reveal how education can be improved as it takes visitors on a thought-provoking journey through a typical school day of Ping from China and Sam from the United States.
