## SANDRA TSING LOH TO HEADLINE LUNCHEON FUNDRAISER

**Fullerton, California – September 21, 2015** – The Museum of Teaching and Learning (MOTAL), a nonprofit organization, will host a fundraiser luncheon on October 17 at the Hotel Fullerton in support of its next project, *Two Roads, One Journey: Education in China and the U.S.* The luncheon will feature Sandra Tsing Loh, who was named by *Variety* as one of America's 50 most influential comedians and whose work ranges from off-Broadway solo shows to radio commentaries on NPR's "Morning Edition" and on Ira Glass' "This American Life." Her weekly "Loh Life" and syndicated "Loh Down on Science" are broadcast on KPCC. Her new book *The Madwoman in the Volvo: My Year of Raging Hormones*, was a *New York Times* 100 Most Notable Books of 2014.

For a ticket price of \$55 (or \$500 for a table of 10), event attendees will be treated to a welcome reception, silent auction (including African photo safari), Chinese buffet lunch and dessert followed by a presentation from the comedian at the Hotel Fullerton.
