THE MUSEUM OF TEACHING AND LEARNING (MOTAL) TO HOST A HIGH TEA HONORING LONGTIME SUPPORTER FRIDA FLUCK

Orange County, CA – May 10, 2011 – The Museum of Teaching and Learning (MOTAL) will host an afternoon tea to honor Frida Fluck, an advocate for education. Ms. Fluck will present the museum with heritage/historic notes from her college studies in the 1940s at UC Berkeley. These books will be part of the museum's permanent collection. The High Tea will be held on Saturday, June 4, 2011, from 3 p.m. until 4:45 p.m. The tea will also recognize men and women volunteers and civic and community leaders who have supported MOTAL.

Women attending the High Tea are encouraged to wear hats and gloves as was the style of the 1940s, which prevails in the museum's upcoming exhibit A Class Action: A Grassroots Struggle for School Desegregation, which opens at the Old County Courthouse in September 2011. Guests are also requested to bring their own teacup and saucer for the tea sampling.

The High Tea will be held at Greta Nagel's home in Fullerton. Ms. Nagel is the founder and executive director of the Museum of Teaching and Learning.
